Eligibility Requirements and Contest Calendar

Children in the grades listed above who are the sons, daughters, grandchild, niece or nephew of members in good standing of an organization affiliated with the United Irish Counties Association in 2012 are eligible to enter the contest.

The enclosed official application form must be completed and postmarked no later than Wednesday, October 31, 2012.

Topic and Manner of Presentation

1.1Topic for grades 6,7 & 8: Irish immigrants have been a contributing factor in the growth and prosperity of the U.S. One of the outstanding immigrants who greatly contributed to the growth of this nation was Commodore John Barry (1745-1803). Kindly describe the life and the contributions of this distinguished leader and why he merits this recognition.

Topic for grades 9 & 10: The history of the American labor movement reflects in no small measure the history of the Irish in America. Please select 3 outstanding Irish labor leaders (both men and women) who have diligently worked to improve the socio-economic conditions of labor from the late 19th century to the present.

1.2 A minimum of 5 and a maximum of 6 typewritten double spaced pages with accompanying bibliography are necessary to satisfy requirements for grades 6,7 &8. A minimum of 7 and a maximum of 8 typewritten double spaced pages with an accompanying bibliography are required to satisfy the 9th and 10th grades.

1.3 Middle Grades Prizes: The first, second and third prizewinners will receive individual prizes of \$800.00, \$500.00 and \$300.00. Junior High
